- Must be a nonprofit charitable organization (501c3) in good standing, and meet the full <u>eligibility requirements</u> in your country. Governmental entities and organizations, hospitals and medical groups, schools, academic institutions and universities are not eligible.
- Begin by applying to Google for Nonprofits.
- 3. Have a high-quality website that meets the Ad Grants website policy.
